If you are reading this letter, you likely already harbor some degree of concern for the sexual climate at your college or university. We at the Love and Fidelity Network urge you to take an active interest in the efforts of your students to challenge the college sexual culture and defend their beliefs and commitments. Your support and involvement will lend credibility to the group and its mission. With so many professors and university staff expressing misunderstanding (or even disdain) for students with such values, it becomes natural for these young men and women to feel isolated on campus. **They gain courage and confidence when they know their work is supported by a scholar such as you.**

One concrete way to show your support is to become a faculty sponsor or advisor to these emerging student groups. If a group does not exist on campus but you know of some courageous students who would be ideal to lead such a project, forward them to our website and express your commitment to helping them get started. When a student comes to you distressed over bias they've encountered in or outside of the classroom, take their concerns seriously and help them express their concerns to the appropriate university administrators or officials.

You have an invaluable role to play in the lives and education of these students. With your help, there will be a definite shift from a one-sided conversation to a thriving and honest exchange of ideas.
